



MYSORE DASARA FESTIVAL



Intricately woven with legends and mythology, the city of Mysore is a storehouse of history and cultural festivities. Local narratives reveal that this place was once ruled by a buffalo-headed demon, Mahishasura. People prayed to the gods to free them from his reign when Goddess Parvathi came to their rescue by taking the form of Chamundeshwari in a battle that lasted for nine days till he was vanquished. The city derives its name from this demon and celebrates this legend with the Dasara Festival, a tradition started by the Vijayanagar kings in the 19th century.

During the festivities, the Mysore Palace is adorned in lights and streets become vibrant with procession of decked-up elephants carrying the idol of Goddess Chamundeshwari in the golden howdah. The Goddess is worshipped by the royal family and masses alike, along with colourful tableaux, ecstatic dancing groups and music bands, horses and camels. Across the illuminated Mysore Palace is the local Dasara exhibition selling clothes, kitchenware, cosmetic products, exquisite handicrafts and local eatables. The nine nights are a celebration of Goddess Durga in all her incarnations with special pujas or prayers leading up to the tenth day, i.e. Vijayadashami to celebrate the victory of good over evil, a day when the Goddess Chamundeshwari slayed Mahishasura. Let's see this city in its full galore and fervour with decorated elephants, garlanded idols, folk dance performances, doll shows, food and film festival, wrestling and other sports, fireworks and much more.





TOUR OVERVIEW

Our journey will lead us to the history, fables and myths of some of the greatest dynasties in Indian history. The Deccan Plateau has seen a succession of kingdoms giving way to some of the most interesting sites of forts, palaces, and temples. We will embark upon this trail of history from the city of Bangalore, popular as the hub of information technology in India. From here we move to Mysore, with its rich past of kings and queens, extravagant durbars, pearled hallways, peasant revolts, and one of the last bastions resisting the British Raj. The old religious myths and legends intermingled during the different kingdoms of Karnataka and reveal themselves in the magnificent ruins at Hospet city, Hampi village, and Hubli city.

Let Le Passage to India take you to the surreal and earthen hues of the Deccan Plateau which hide within it the beauty of the work of artisans and crafts persons in the many temples and palaces, and history and legends are told and retold, and traditions are kept alive in modern day festivities and practices.






BANGALORE Visit one of the most beautiful Botanical Gardens of the East.




Join in the celebrations of the Dasara Festival and listen to the fascinating tale of defeat of a demon at the hands of a goddess.




CHIKMAGALUR


